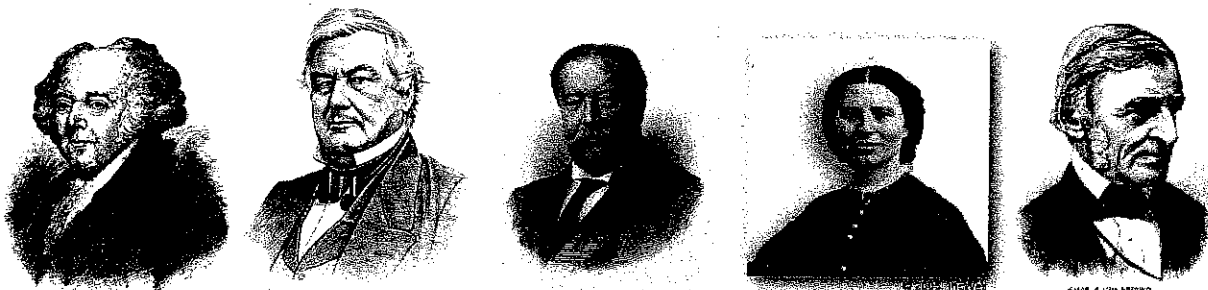


What is Unitarian Universalism?

What is Reproductive Justice?

Unitarian Universalists affirm the inherent worth and dignity of every person, believing in personal and responsible decision-making for oneself. Another principle we live by is justice, equity and compassion in human relations, thus we cannot support the imposition of any religious or political belief on families, the very fabric of our communities.

Unitarian Universalists affirm Reproductive Justice, a concept put forward by coalitions of women of color which promotes the right of all women to have children, to not have children, and to raise their children in safe and healthy environments free from oppression due to economic hardship, racial injustice, gender bias, or sexual orientation.
